PROGRAMME INFORMATION

The MA in Film offers you the opportunity to choose a specific pathway and combine it with elements of theory and practice. The three pathways we offer are **Theory**, **Documentary Practice** and **Directing Fiction**.

Students on all pathways will complete 180 credits in total comprising of 60 credits of compulsory modules, 60 credits of optional modules and a 60-credit Dissertation or Final Project (depending on the chosen pathway).

Students taking practice modules in either semester will be required to do a semester long technical foundation workshop. This will begin in week 2 and comprises 2-3 hour workshops. Details will be supplied in due course.

Theory

You will consider key aspects of film analysis, theory, history and practice. You will learn practical filmmaking skills, as well as gain excellent research expertise, that could provide a pathway to a PhD.	
Preparatory reading: If you have not previously studied film, it would help you to consult a primer in Film Studies, such as James Monaco (2009) <i>How to Read a Film: Movies, Media, and Beyond</i> (New York: Oxford University Press), David Bordwell and Kristin Thompson (2016) <i>Film Art: An Introduction</i> (Boston: McGraw-Hill), or John Gibbs (2002) <i>Mise-en-scène: Film Style and Interpretation</i> (New York and London: Columbia University Press).

MODULE REGISTRATION

How do I register for my modules?

You will register for your modules using [MySIS](#). The Module Registration Task will become available to you after you have completed the Pre-Enrolment task. Please log in and select the 'Module Registration' option. Your core or compulsory modules may have already been pre-selected for you and they cannot be changed.

Before you start making module selections in MySIS please read the guidance below.

When you come to select the elective modules that you want to take you will be able to review the description of a module within MySIS by clicking on the module name.

It is not possible to submit or approve a partial module selection, so make sure you have selected modules from both Semesters.

Please submit your selections in MySIS by 4th September 2023.

Your submission will be considered after this date in the School's approval process and may not be confirmed until after the Induction Meeting, where you will also be allocated an academic adviser who can offer further advice on your choice of elective modules.

Some modules may become over or under subscribed, so you may be asked to change your selection at that time. You can request changes to approved modules within the first two weeks of Semester 1 using the same MySIS task.

To make this process easier, we will ask you to provide us with some reserve modules. When you submit your main selection of modules, MySIS will open a new screen for you to select your reserves. You will need to select the required number of reserve modules from each selection box to be able to complete the submission.

Please consider your reserve modules carefully and ensure they are modules you would be happy to take. We will make every effort to allocate you to your first-choice modules, but this may not always be possible.

Access to materials in QMplus (online learning environment) will be available within 24 hours of your module registration being approved.

Alternative Optional Modules

Intercollegiate Screen Studies Programme

The intercollegiate option-sharing agreements under the University of London Screen Studies Group (SSG) allow you to take **one** option from one of the Film and Media MA programmes at **Birkbeck, Goldsmiths, Institute of Education, King's College London***, **School of African and Oriental Studies** or **University College London** (*Modules at Kings are only available to students on the Theory pathway).

Options offered as part of the intercollegiate option-sharing agreement at 15 or 30 credits have the equivalent value at QMUL. Where KCL offer a 20-credit option, this will have the equivalent value of 30 credits at QMUL and you will be required to take an additional item of assessment at QMUL to make up the missing credits.

SSG modules are normally published in August and available online via the Goldsmiths website. For module information and contact details please visit [Screen Studies Group MA Options](#).

You must initially register for your full 60 credits of optional modules from the list of FLM-coded modules for your pathway, as shown on the above pages.

How to apply for an intercollegiate option

In the first instance you will need to apply directly to the host institution for the module you would like to take. Please **do not** select an intercollegiate option (IN-coded module) as your main choice in MySIS. You may find that these can be selected as reserve choices. However, the module may be incorrect or missing in MySIS until we have received confirmation of the module details and your place on the module. Once an intercollegiate place has been confirmed by the host institution it will be possible to amend your existing main selection in MySIS.

- Once you have decided which module you would like to take, please contact the host institution to register your interest. They will provide you with an Intercollegiate Application Form to complete for their institution.
- You will need to complete this application form and send it to your MA Film Programme Convenor (Ms Athena Mandis at a.mandis@qmul.ac.uk) at QMUL for academic authorisation.
- Send the signed form to the SLLF Programme Admin Team (sllf-progadmin@qmul.ac.uk) for QMUL administrative authorisation.
- The form can then be forwarded electronically to the intercollegiate administrator for their consideration.
- Failure to complete the form may result in your place on the intercollegiate module being cancelled by the host institution and your SSG module selection will not be processed at QMUL
