

Timetabling FAQs

1. What is a personal timetable?

A personal timetable is tailored to you based on your course and module enrolments, including both core and optional modules. It also reflects your specific class allocations when classes are offered multiple times.

2. What is required to generate a timetable?

Students need to be enrolled and have their modules registered on MYSIS. It may take up to 48 hours after registration for your timetable to appear, with your lectures and labs allocated accordingly.

3. Where can I find my timetable?

You can view your timetable [online](#), where it updates instantly. While it's also available on the QMUL app, updates take longer there, so we recommend using the online version during the first couple of weeks.

4. What if a module is missing from my timetable?

Changes or updates from module selections may take up to 48 hours to appear. If your timetable still seems incomplete after that, please email eccs-danda@qmul.ac.uk.

5. Will my timetable change?

Timetables released before the start of the term are subject to changes, so we advise against planning around them until teaching begins, after which there should be fewer changes. Check your timetable frequently for updates.

6. Can I change the classes I'm in?

Students are randomly allocated to their labs/tutorial groups. Changes will only be considered if there is a valid reason (e.g., part-time student), and if space is available in the desired session.
