



Attendance and Engagement

Attending your Lectures and Tutorials is a <u>compulsory</u> part of your academic progression.

Lecture Attendance:

- ❖Attendance at <u>lectures</u> is monitored by a new attendance app called Campus M.
- ❖The Campus M Attendance recording solution is available via the QMUL mobile app which can be downloaded from the Apple Store or Google Play
- ❖ Each lecture throughout the teaching week will have a unique code which is valid for one-time use only.
- Engagement data is collected and utilised for welfare and engagement purposes (i.e. by Professional Services teams supporting you to succeed in your studies.)



Exam Access Arrangement

Students with disabilities, specific learning differences such as dyslexia and short-term health conditions (e.g. broken limbs, pregnancy) can apply to the <u>Disability and Dyslexia Service</u> for Examination Access Arrangements (EAA).

Extenuating Circumstances

Extenuating circumstances (ECs) are defined by QMUL as: "...circumstances that are outside a student's control and which may have a negative impact on a student's ability to undertake or complete any assessment so as to cast doubt the likely validity of the assessment as a measure of the student's achievement."


