The **League Tables app** is the next generation league table creation tool in Thomson Reuters Eikon. You can quickly and easily create Thomson Reuters industry-standard M&A, Bond, Equity, and Syndicated Loan League Table rankings with the League Tables app. These widely published league tables provide insight into market trends, the ability to benchmark versus peers and scoring useful across many types of ad hoc internal reporting.

- With the app you can now create and replicate Thomson Reuters published league table data without needing to know any formulas or codes. Simply start with one of the standard sessions from the drop down and adjust the customization options as required.

TOP TIPS ON HOW TO USE THE APP

- To access the League Tables app, enter “League table” in the search box and select it from the search results or use the short code **LEAGT**.
- Make your selection from the “Asset Class” drop down, the League Table options available to you update automatically.
- Simply click on the drop down to select or begin typing the code for the table that you would like to generate.

- Change your **date range** from either the three available popular date ranges or create a custom date range.
- “**Segment by**” options include Industry and Nation/Region for all tables and **Issue type** for Bonds and Equity.
- Adjust the number of results from the “**Display Top**” drop down, with up to 99 results available.
- Click through any of the items on the league table to view the **full deal list** and summary content. Toggle between advisors/bookrunners from this page.
