What is a Physician Associate?

'Physician associates (previously called physician assistants) provide generalist clinical care in general practice, typically seeing people with acute minor illness. They have two years training, most after a basic science degree.

This training follows the model of a medical qualification (for example, taking histories, performing examinations, making diagnoses, interpreting tests). Unlike the US, physician associates in the UK need authorisation from a doctor when they judge that a patient needs a prescription.

Working under the supervision of a GP, they can make a significant contribution to practice workload.'

Teaching PA students

Our MSc programme sees students placed in primary care from term 2, in total they spend 48 days over the 2 years on placement in primary care. They start by shadowing GPs and other members of the primary care team as they consult; and throughout the placement build their skills in taking histories, clinical examinations and managing common conditions.

By the end of the programme students will be able to see patients independently in their own clinics under supervision by a GP.

Previous students have chosen to work in primary care as a result of their inspirational placement. They have been helped to develop the skills and knowledge necessary to pass the national licensing exam and succeed as a health professional in the NHS.
