

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#### **Work Experience Opportunities**

- <u>Qtemps</u> Paid temporary work for Queen Mary students and graduates, including roles on campus and with our external business partners.
- <u>Qmentoring</u> will pair you with a mentor with whom you can explore your career ideas, or if you are looking to acquire experience can help you gain a deeper understanding of a particular career or industry.
- <u>QTaster</u> helps you gain insight into different companies and roles. It also helps those looking to build their network and commercial awareness.
- <u>Student Consultancy Project (SCP)</u> Gain first-hand experience working with a client whilst receiving support from a Queen Mary supervisor. This programme gives you the opportunity to develop skills you can take forward into any profession - not just consultancy.
- <u>Micro Internships</u> Take part in a short internship with a business, charity or social enterprise and gain experience in a real-life, professional setting with support and training from Queen Mary careers and internships staff.





## What are my work experience options?

Some psychology graduates become professional psychologists, but many go on to work in related fields, so consider your options.

Here are some ideas. Some will offer formal internships, others may be open to providing informal volunteering opportunities:

- NHS your local NHS trust, hospital or GP surgery
- Charities especially mental health/disability
- Social services (by London borough)
- Human resources jobs (HR) in any industry
- Local & national government
- Marketing agencies & in-house marketing roles in any industry
- The media
- Police, National Probation Service & Prisons
- Schools & Colleges
- Psychotherapy centres
- Data analytics companies



#### **Remember!**

#### 83% of graduate jobs are 'degree agnostic'

- There are many careers you can pursue with your degree, in or beyond science.
- You may want to get more general work experience and transferable skills in your first year, then aim for a sector-specific internship in your second year.
- Your study subject does not dictate your career options.

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#### Internships, placements & jobs: when to apply

Autumn & winter: Larger businesses with formal application processes:

- Psychometric testing
- Assessment centres
- Online games etc.

Spring: Smaller businesses

- CVs
- Cover letters

Any time of year: Voluntary, Speculative applications (use your discretion)

- Apply early vacancies are often filled before deadlines
- Quality over quantity!
- Life goes on if you don't get the perfect internship

#### Use Google to search directly for employers

Search using the employer name, job role or industry e.g. 'marketing agency London'

#### **Alternatively:**

- · Look out for Careers emails
- Create your own opportunity with a speculative application



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### **Graduate Schemes**

- Normally involve working on rotation for 1 3 years, giving you experience of different areas within the business.
- Tend to be with larger businesses so apply ASAP in autumn.
- Great career option, but relatively few graduates end up on a grad scheme, so apply for other grad jobs too.
- Similar search process and timeline for graduate schemes/jobs as with internships & placements.

#### Skills

#### **Essential criteria**

- Excellent verbal and written communication skills, including telephone skills
- High level of enthusiasm and motivation
- Ability to work within a team and foster good working relationships
- Ability to use clinical supervision and personal development positively and effectively
- Ability to work independently within defined occupational procedures and use initiative within a service

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#### BSc with Professional Experience – Annual Placement

- For students who have completed their 2nd year of study.
- Duration: One academic year; minimum of 900 hours; 30-40 weeks.
- You will submit self-reflective assignments.





#### **Placement Types**

#### Self-arranged placements

- You will most likely do this.
- Best chance of getting something you want to do.

#### Advertised placements

- Advertised online (e.g., ratemyplacement.co.uk).
- QM Careers Hub and Qmplus Information for Psychology Students Careers & Work Experience (check regularly!)
- Competitive process (application, interview and selection).
- Not enough for everyone.

#### Don't wait for the 'ideal' placement & be open-minded! Placements may be paid or unpaid.

- You'll need a first or upper second class degree, and evidence of excellent research skills to apply.
- You'll also need relevant work experience.
- It takes a long time to qualify potentially around ten years from starting university. Will you be OK with this?
