# **KEY SED CONTACTS**

#### WHO ARE MY CONTACTS AS A JOINT HONOUR'S/ INTERDISCIPLINARY DEGREE STUDENT WITHIN SED?

There are contacts for specific areas within SED:

- <u>sed-information@qmul.ac.uk</u> for general queries related to your teaching and learning, for example QMplus, module registration and timetabling.
- <u>sed-international@qmul.ac.uk</u> for Associate, Study Abroad (for a semester), With a Year Abroad and international gueries.

- <u>sed-studentsupport@qmul.ac.uk</u> for student support queries, for example, when your wellbeing is affecting your studies, disability and dyslexia enquiries or enquiries regarding Extenuating Circumstances.

### DO I HAVE A SED ADVISOR?

Yes, all joint honours students will be allocated an Advisor within SED (you will also have an advisor in your home school) who will be able to support you throughout your studies. You will meet them during Welcome Week and at regular intervals thereafter.

Students on an interdisciplinary programme will only have an advisor in their home school.

#### DO I HAVE A COURSE REP AND HOW DO THEY FEED INFORMATION BACK TO SED?

During the first couple of weeks of term you will be electing a Course Representative for your programme, and they will be a key student contact between the schools. Although Interdisciplinary degree students do not attend Student Staff Liaison Committees for SED, they are able to feed information back via **their Course Representatives**.

#### WHEN ARE ACADEMICS ADVICE AND FEEDBACK HOURS/OFFICE HOURS?

If you wish to speak with your Module Organiser or seminar leader, you can speak with them during their Advice and Feedback Hours. You can book a slot via the staff Drop-In hours pages on QMplus <a href="here">here</a>. You can contact the relevant academic by emailing them to request a meeting at an alternative time.

Feedback and provisional marks will be released via QMplus as indicated on the relevant submission area. Please note that marks in QMplus are provisional, and late penalties etc are only applied when marks are transferred to MySiS in February/June.
