<u>Module Registration Guidance for First Year Students of French and Politics –</u> 2024-25

Welcome to the School of the Arts (STA), here at Queen Mary University of London.

As a new first year student of French and Politics you now need to choose 30 credits of POL-coded Politics modules.

All students must take 120 credits (including your core/compulsory modules), over two semesters (Semester A: September – December and Semester B: January – April).

General Guidance

- The School of Politics and International Relations requires you to choose 30 credits of Politics (POL-coded) modules. Please follow any instructions you receive directly from them, regarding how to complete module registration.
- All of your French modules are core/compulsory and so you do not have any further choices to make with STA.

Your Modules

As a first year student, you are required to take the following core/compulsory module(s):

- Depending on your language level, you will be placed onto ONE of the following:
 - o FRE4202 Introductory French [Beginners] (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
 - o FRE4202 French I Intensive [Post GCSE] (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
 - o FRE4200 French I [Post A-Level] (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
- SML4006 Culture and Language (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
- POL110 Thinking Politically (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).

TOTAL: 90 credits (45 credits in Semester A and 45 credits in Semester B).

You now need to choose 30 credits of Politics (POL-coded) modules from EITHER:

- o POL105 Political Analysis (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4)
- OR: POL113 Politics in Action (15 credits, Semester A, Level 4) AND POL108 Background to British Politics (15 credits, Semester B)
- OR: POL113 Politics in Action (15 credits, Semester A, Level 4) AND POL109 Global Histories (15 credits, Semester B, Level 4)
