

Module Registration Guidance for First Year Students of German and Comparative Literature – 2024-25

Welcome to the School of The Arts (STA), here at Queen Mary University of London.

As a new first year student of German and Comparative Literature your 120 credits of modules are core/compulsory, meaning you do not have any optional module choices to make.

All students must take 120 credits (including your core/compulsory modules), over two semesters (Semester A: September – December and Semester B: January – April).

Your Modules

As a first year student, you are required to take the following core/compulsory module(s):

- Depending on your language level, you will be placed onto **ONE** of the following:
 - GER4201 Introductory German [Beginners] (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
 - GER4205 German I Intensive [Post GCSE] (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
 - GER4204 German I [Post A-Level/Native/Heritage Speaker] (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
- SML4006 Culture and Language (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
- COM4207 The Scene of Learning (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
- COM4206 Introduction to Comparison (15 credits, Semester A, Level 4).
- COM4210 Understanding Culture: Exploring the Big Questions (15 credits, Semester B, Level 4).
