**Module Title:** Documentary – Theory and Practice

Module Code: FLM501

Level: 5

**Content Description** 

This module requires students to put theory into practice by cultivating a sense of the

history and theory of documentary alongside the chance to make a short documentary

film. The first part of the module will chart the historical development of documentary

filmmaking through the examination of several case studies ranging from the early

twentieth century to the present day, with the focus on issues of truth, ethics, technique

and creativity. The second part of the module requires you to produce a short

documentary film that engages with four key issues related to documentary filmmaking:

1) locating the truth you want to convey; 2) ensuring that you adhere to an ethical code

whilst producing your film; 3) engaging with storytelling, exposition, visual and

structuring techniques, including considering how meaning is made in post-production

and 4) exploring creative formal approaches appropriate to your film.

**Module Aims** 

On the completion of this module students will have:

Gained an understanding of the historical development of documentary and the

ability to evaluate individual documentary films in relation to theoretical issues

located around questions of fact, ethics, narrative and editing

Attained the ability to engage critically with own work in planning, production

and post-production stages

To grasp the interrelatedness of theory and practice through reflection on own

filmmaking and examination of the work of other documentary filmmakers

Demonstrate personal qualities (such as independent learning, writing and

researching to a high level) and transferable skills (such as negotiation/working

effectively with others, communication, objective-setting, planning and creativity) attained through independent study, film production, essay writing and seminar presentations.
