Module title: Catalan Literature: An Introduction Module code: HSP5055 Credit value: 15 Level: 5 Pre-requisite modules:

Content Description

How did a language with so few speakers give rise to texts of world importance? Covering examples by well-known writers from the medieval period to the present, this module provides an overview of Catalan literature. Theatre, mystical prose, modern novels and postmodern short stories are analyzed and discussed on their own stylistic terms and in relation to historical and aesthetic developments. Love and war, as well as national and personal identity make for a potent literary mixture.

Module Aims

1. To introduce students to modern and contemporary Catalan literature.

- 2. To enable students to contextualize each of the texts studied in class in historical terms.
- 3. To enable students to contextualize each of the texts studied in class in aesthetic terms.
- 4. To enable students to contextualize each of the texts studied in class in philosophical terms.
- 5. To provide students with the knowledge and skills to analyze complex literary texts.
- 6. To expose students to a variety of critical approaches to literary texts.

7. The additional aim for the amendment is that the students taking the module as HSP should. understand the Spanish context of the texts and read all of them in Spanish (if they are in SPAN II) and a selection of them - Monzo and Guimera - (if they are in SPAN II IN).
