Module title: Portuguese II Module code: POR5201 Credit value: 30 Level: 5 Pre-requisite modules:

Content Description

This module is offered to students pursuing a degree in Hispanic Studies and Portuguese, who have A Level in Portuguese/equivalent, and/or who are heritage speakers of Portuguese and have taken POR4201. Successful students will reach Level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFRL). The module develops Portuguese grammar, comprehension, oral, aural and analytical skills, with an emphasis on the appropriate use of register in both spoken and written Portuguese and preparation for the Year Abroad.

Module Aims

1. The module aims will address the Standards for Foreign Language Learning in the 21st Century, which focus on five general areas: Communicating (in Portuguese), Cultures (of the Portuguese-Speaking countries), Connecting (with other disciplines and cultures), and Communities (of speakers, here and abroad).

2. The specific goal of Portuguese II is to develop Portuguese grammar, comprehension, oral, aural and analytical skills, with an emphasis on the appropriate use of register in both spoken and written Portuguese, as well as to build students' awareness of Lusophone cultures, particularly Portugal's and Brazil's, in preparation for the Year Abroad.

3. Different kinds of readings, compositions, and class presentations will play an important part in this second-year module. The module will help students to achieve a better understanding of work and study placements and the recruitment and selection process in target countries of their Year Abroad (in Portugal or Brazil).

Learning Outcomes

A3 Linguistic competences: Using figures of speech; Elaborating lexical and semantic fields; Using homonyms, homophones and homographs; Identifying words of foreign origin; Using idiomatic expressions, proverbs and common sayings; Vocabulary for argument, thoughts, wishes and ideas; expressions of disagreement and regret;

A4 Reading and Comprehension: Analysing and commenting on newspaper articles, films and literary works; Analysing and commenting on social history, national and international cultural narratives; A5 Writing: The structure and vocabulary of journalistic texts; The structure of narrative and descriptions; Writing newspaper articles; Reviewing films and plays; Writing commentaries, summaries and comparing short stories; Short oral mediation and translation exercises.

A6 Aural Comprehension and Oral Production: Listening to authentic material (informal and formal discussions on a variety of themes; television, theatre, film and radio material); Debating, reporting and presenting on a variety of themes.
