Welcome to the School of The Arts (STA), here at Queen Mary University of London.

As a new first year student of Drama with Creative Writing your 120 credits of modules are core/compulsory, meaning you do not have any optional module choices to make.

All students must take 120 credits (including your core/compulsory modules), over two semesters (Semester A: September – December and Semester B: January – April).

As a first year student, you are required to take the following core/compulsory module(s):

- DRA123 Power Plays (15 credits, Semester A, Level 4).
- DRA124 Making Theatre and Performance (30 credits, Semester A, Level 4).
- DRA125 Performance, Acting, Text (30 credits, Semester B, Level 4).
- DRA122 Spectatorship: Time, Place, Performance (15 credits, Semester B, Level 4).
- ESH4101 Introduction to Creative Writing (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
