

Module Registration Guidance for First Year Students of English – 2025-26

Welcome to the School of The Arts (STA), here at Queen Mary University of London.

As a new first year student of English your 120 credits of modules are core/compulsory, meaning you do not have any optional module choices to make.

All students must take 120 credits (including your core/compulsory modules), over two semesters (Semester A: September – December and Semester B: January – April).

Your Modules

As a first year student, you are required to take the following core/compulsory module(s):

- ESH102 Reading, Theory and Interpretation: approaches to the study of English Literature (30 credits, Semester B, Level 4).
- ESH101 Shakespeare (30 credits, Semester A, Level 4)
- ESH129 Literatures in Time: Epic and Romance in the Middle Ages (15 credits, Semester B, Level 4)
- ESH124 Poetry (15 credits, Semester A, Level 4)
- ESH126 London Global (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4)
