

Module Registration Guidance for First Year Students of English and History – 2025-26

Welcome to the School of The Arts (STA), here at Queen Mary University of London.

As a new first year student of English and History you now need to choose 30 credits of HST-coded History modules.

All students must take 120 credits (including your core/compulsory modules), over two semesters (Semester A: September – December and Semester B: January – April).

General Guidance

- The History side of your programme requires you to choose 30 credits of History (HST-coded) modules. Please follow any instructions you receive directly from them, regarding how to complete module registration.

Your Modules

As a first year student, you are required to take the following core/compulsory module(s):

- ESH126 London Global (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
- ESH129 Literatures in Time: Epic and Romance in the Middle Ages (15 credits, Semester B, Level 4).
- ESH124 Poetry (15 credits, Semester A, Level 4)
- HST4430 History in Practice (10 credits, Semester A, Level 4).
- HST4011 History Essay 1 (10 credits, Semester A, Level 4).
- HST4012 History Essay 2 (10 credits, Semester B, Level 4).

TOTAL: 120 credits (50 credits in Semester A and 40 credits in Semester B).

You now need to choose 30 credits of **HST-coded** modules. To ensure your modules are balanced equally across both semesters, you will need to ensure that **10 credits** are from **Semester A** and **20 credits** are from **Semester B**.

You must choose to take **EITHER:**

- HST4330 Unravelling Britain: British History since 1801 (10 credits, Semester A, Level 4)
- HST4431 Global Encounters: Conquest and Culture in World History (10 credits, Semester B, Level 4)

To complete your module registration, you must then choose a further TWO, 10 credits of HST-coded modules at Level 4. Please remember to ensure that your modules are balance 60-60 credits across both Semester A and Semester B.

What happens next?

Once you have submitted your preferred and reserve choices modules into MySIS, the STA Education Team will consider your requests before finalising your choices.

Submitting your choices does not mean that you have automatically been allocated a place on these modules. When your modules have been confirmed (your MySIS record will show your selection as 'CON'), and your timetable will populate within 24-48 hours (sometimes longer depending on the system) and then you will be allocated to any specific seminars/groups.

If we are unable to accommodate any of your choices (both preferred or reserve choices), the STA Education Team will select a module on your behalf to complete your module registration.

If you wish to make a change to your confirmed modules, you will be able to submit a Module Change Request. Information regarding how to do this can be found on Page 15 of the [Student MySIS Module Registration Guide](#).

Should you wish to discuss your module choices with your Academic Advisor, you will be able to arrange to do so during Welcome Week (you will receive further information regarding your Academic Advisor during Welcome Week).
