<u>Module Registration Guidance for First Year Students of Modern Languages</u> (One Language) – 2025-26

Welcome to the School of The Arts (STA), here at Queen Mary University of London.

As a new first year student of Modern Languages (One Language), you now need to choose the Language (French, German, Russian or Spanish) and correct level, you wish to study and enter the following 60 credits of modules (listed below) into MySIS.

All students must take 120 credits (including your core/compulsory modules), over two semesters (Semester A: September – December and Semester B: January – April).

General Guidance

- You can only choose Level 4 modules from those listed in your programme regulations.
- You must balance your module choices equally across both Semesters (e.g. 60 credits in Semester A and 60 credits in Semester B).
- Modules are valued at 15 or 30 credits. Generally, 15 credits run in a single semester and 30 credits run across both semesters. However, there are some exceptions, particularly in Language modules and Linguistics modules.
- You cannot choose the same module multiple times or choose different levels of a language you may already be studying.

Choosing your Modules

As a first year student, you are required to take the following core/compulsory module(s):

Depending on the language you choose to do and your language level, you will be placed onto **ONE** of the following:

- French Language: FRE4202 Introductory French [Beginners], FRE4202 French I Intensive [Post GCSE], or FRE4200 French I [Post A-Level]
- German Language: GER4201 Introductory German [Beginners], GER4205 German I Intensive [Post GCSE], or GER4204 German I [Post A-Level and Native Speakers]
- Russian Language: RUS4203 Introductory Russian [Beginners], RUS4204 Russian I Intensive [Post GCSE], RUS4201 Russian I [Post A-Level] or, RUS4202 Russian I N [Native Speakers]
- Spanish Language: HSP4200 Introductory Spanish [Beginners], HSP4201 Spanish I
 [Post A-Level], or HSP4202 Spanish I N [Native Speakers].

You are also required to take the following modules:

- SML4006 Culture and Language (30 credits, Full Year, Level 4).
- SML4203 Love Poetry in the Middle Ages: Literary Analysis and Al-Assisted Creative Rewriting (15 credits, Semester B, Level 4)
- SML4204 AI and Languages (15 credits, Semester A, Level 4)
- SML4205 History and/as Fiction (15 credits, Semester A, Level 4)
- SML4206 Understanding Contemporary Societies (15 credits, Semester B, Level 4)

As a new first year student of Modern Languages (Two Languages), you now need to choose your two Languages from French, German, Russian or Spanish and correct level, you wish to study and choose your remaining 30 credits of optional modules (from the list below).

All students must take 120 credits (including your core/compulsory modules), over two semesters (Semester A: September – December and Semester B: January – April).

General Guidance

- You cannot choose to take two beginner level languages. You must have Post GCSE, Post A-Level or Heritage/Native Speaker level knowledge in one of the languages you choose.
- You can only choose Level 4 modules from the list provided below.
- You must balance your module choices equally across both Semesters (e.g. 60 credits in Semester A and 60 credits in Semester B).
- Modules are valued at 15 or 30 credits. Generally, 15 credits run in a single semester and 30 credits run across both semesters. However, there are some exceptions, particularly in Language modules and Linguistics modules.
